News Extra – Around Campus

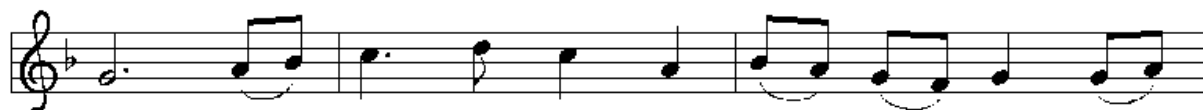

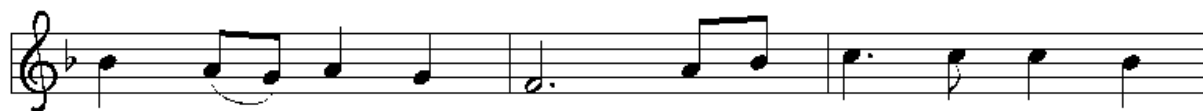
