Today: "Embrace His Glory" • Mark 9:2-9; Exodus 34:29-35; 2 Corinthians 3:12-18; 4:1-6 • While upon a mountain with Peter, James, and John, Jesus' clothes "became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them." Jesus' appearance is "transfigured." The Son of God has allowed His glory—the glory that was His since before the foundation of the world—to shine through. While it might seem easy to think about embracing Jesus' glory, Jesus' earthly ministry is at the place where everything He does, every step He takes, brings us closer to the ignominy of the cross. To embrace His glory will mean embracing the cross of God's beloved Son, listening to Him.

About Our Sermon Series: Embrace • At the beginning of this new year, we have opportunity to embrace the uncertainty of the days ahead with a sure confidence in the God who goes with us, whose hand is leading us and whose love is supporting us. Food Pantry Fund Drive

As we begin the final quarter of the year, we are inviting our community to support the work of the Food Pantry at Prince of Peace / Príncipe de Paz. Our goal is to raise \$25,000 (either in one-time gifts or regular recurring gifts).

Your support will help us address Food Insecurity in our community.

- Costs to operate the Food Pantry have risen dramatically since the pandemic.
 - We are serving more people than we ever have (400 families per month, representing nearly 2000 people each month).
 - o By partnering with Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida, keeping our costs low: For \$15 per family per month we provide the same amount of nutrition and food as we would if we spent \$100 at a grocery store.
- From July 2022-June 2023, our food costs were just under \$57,000.
 - Second Harvest estimates the retail value of that food at over \$259,000.
 - \circ Our cost for food staples, though, like your own groceries, have gone up as much as 40%.
- The Food Pantry is supported entirely through special gifts and grants. We depend on donations. We do not receive funds through the Prince of Peace / Príncipe de Paz budget.
- We will receive a \$25,000 grant through the City of Orlando Community Investment Program in 2024. We are grateful to have our proposal chosen.
- Every month, more than 50 volunteers help in the Food Pantry. Annually, more than 3000 hours are donated by those who give of their time.
- Your ongoing commitment of 50 ¢ a day, \$15/month, can provide groceries for one of the 400 families we serve.
- We also welcome larger one-time gifts of \$1,000, \$5,000, or \$10,000 to help ensure the long-term sustainability of this vital outreach.

Campaña de recaudación de fondos para la despensa de alimentos

Al comenzar el último trimestre del año, estamos invitando a nuestra comunidad a apoyar el trabajo de la Despensa de Alimentos en Prince of Peace / Príncipe de Paz. Nuestro objetivo es recaudar \$ 25,000 (ya sea en donaciones únicas o donaciones recurrentes regulares). Su apoyo nos ayudará a abordar la inseguridad alimentaria en nuestra comunidad.

- Los costos para operar la Despensa de Alimentos han aumentado dramáticamente desde la pandemia.
 - Estamos sirviendo a más personas que nunca (400 familias por mes, lo que representa casi 2000 personas cada mes).
 - Al asociarnos con Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida, mantenemos nuestros costos bajos: Con \$ 15 por familia por mes, proporcionamos la misma cantidad de nutrición y alimentos que si gastáramos \$ 100 en un supermercado.
- Desde julio de 2022 hasta junio de 2023, nuestros costos de alimentos fueron de poco menos de \$ 57,000.
 - Second Harvest estima que el valor minorista de estos alimentos es de más de \$ 259,000.
 - o Sin embargo, nuestro costo de alimentos básicos, como los comestibles que usted compra, ha aumentado en un 40%.
- La despensa de alimentos se mantiene en su totalidad a través de donaciones y subvenciones especiales. Dependemos de donaciones. No recibimos fondos a través del presupuesto de Prince of Peace / Príncipe de Paz.
- Recibiremos una ayuda de \$25,000 a través del Programa de Inversión Comunitaria de la Ciudad de Orlando en 2024. Agradecemos que se haya elegido nuestra propuesta.
- Cada mes, más de 50 voluntarios ayudan en la Despensa de Alimentos. Anualmente, más de 3000 horas de trabajo son donadas por aquellos que dan de su tiempo.
- Su compromiso continuo de 50 centavos por día, \$ 15 / mes, puede proporcionar comestibles para una de las 400 familias a las que servimos.
- También damos la bienvenida a donaciones únicas más grandes de \$ 1,000, \$ 5,000 o \$ 10,000 para ayudar a garantizar la sostenibilidad a largo plazo de este alcance.
